PPCCC Leads on Monkeypox by Dr. Maryam Guiahi, PPCCC Chief Medical Officer

Over the summer, we saw a worldwide outbreak of Monkeypox (Mpox). This virus is transmitted through close contact, which can include sexual contact. Currently, the primary mode of transmission has been close or sexual contact, and the primary population impacted has been men who have sex with men (MSM). On August 2, California declared Mpox a public health emergency given the increasing rates of infection, predominantly in San Francisco and Los Angeles.

In late July, PPCCC diagnosed the first case of Mpox in our three-county service area in a patient who presented for care in Ventura County. After diagnosis, we learned that significant barriers in our communities existed for patients in need of treatment. In particular, access to an anti-viral medication (tecovirimat or TPOXX) was extremely limited. Our team worked hard to secure medication for the patient we diagnosed, who reported that we were like an “angel on earth” for caring for them, especially at a time when the new virus was highly stigmatized.

Given the role PPCCC plays as a trusted and nonjudgmental healthcare resource for vulnerable communities, we jumped in to play a leading role in the local community response. We quickly implemented disease protocols which included educating the team on the disease and creating a screening policy. We partnered with the California Public Health Department and our local public health departments to become a tecovirimat (TPOXX) provider. TPOXX is a drug that is FDA approved for smallpox and has been shown to be effective in the treatment of Mpox. Currently, we are one of the few TPOXX providers in our three-county region.

In partnership with community organizations, like Pacific Pride Foundation, Gay and Lesbian Alliance (GALA), Cottage Health, Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics, UCSB and all three public health departments in our region, we are working to improve education and prevention efforts. This has included an Mpox Town Hall which was attended by 100 community members. We also introduced two vaccine opportunities hosted by Pacific Pride Foundation in Santa Barbara on August 18 and in Santa Maria on August 25th. Many of our providers served as volunteers at these events to accommodate over 200 community members seeking vaccination.

We are seeing the impact of these education and prevention efforts as infection rates have lowered and new cases rates are plateauing or declining. We continue to remain in close collaboration with public health agencies in monitoring this disease and intervening as needed.

At PPCCC, one of our values is “we return to our mission.” Our six health centers were still acclimating to seeing an influx of out-of-state patients seeking abortion care as a result of the Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s Health decision, which overturned the protections of Roe v. Wade as Mpox came to our communities. We are so proud of their dedication and commitment to mission which drove our timely and effective response to Mpox, even with so much else happening in our world.



PPCCC Welcomes New Board Members

Alejandra Mahoney spent 15 years with Peoples Self-Help Housing (PSHH) until her early retirement in 2021. As Director of Education, she oversaw development and administration of PSHH K-8 After-School and College Club programs at 11 learning centers, and worked with numerous local and grant funders on mutual priorities. She has guided education initiatives across the Central Coast, serving as a board member for the FUND, and as an ambassador for Allan Hancock Community College and Leadership Santa Maria Valley. Alejandra was also a co-organizer, Charter Board Member and Founding Board President of the Central Coast Future Leaders (CCFL), a local nonprofit serving Latino youth and parents that emphasizes youth leadership and empowerment.



Before transitioning to a career in education, Alejandra worked for her family agricultural business. As co-owner of TKP Farms, one of the first certified organic farms in the area, she became engaged not only in organic farming, but in organic farming development and public education. She is a past Board Member and President of the California Certified Organic Farmers' San Luis Obispo Chapter, where she worked on organic system plans, policy, certifications, and outreach to farmers, communities and policymakers.



Sarah Valverde, LMFT has spent her career in non-profit organizations specializing in trauma-informed mental health care within Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties. She provided child and family therapy services at CALM in Santa Maria for six years before becoming a child forensic interview specialist and supervisor at CALM. In 2018 Sarah took the position of Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) Coordinator for the county of Santa Barbara. Sarah enjoys presenting at conferences like the California Sexual Assault Investigators Association and guest lectures for Cal Poly's Psychologist and Child Development Graduate Students. Sarah continues to provide child, adult, and family therapy through her private practice in Santa Maria, CA.

Minako Watabe, MD, the Chief Medical Officer at Ventura County Medical Center (VCMC), is one of the skilled OB/GYNs who work within the Ventura County Health Care Agency working with patients in Santa Paula and Ventura, delivering babies at Santa Paula Hospital and Ventura County Medical Center. She also leads the VCMC's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion work.

Minako decided in college that she wanted to pursue a career in medicine, even while tackling subjects she was equally passionate about: public policy, public health, and social justice. But it was treating a diverse group of patients as an OB/GYN that ultimately won out. It was this same passion that led Minako to obtain a master's degree in public health in 2021.

When she is not treating patients or spending time with her two daughters, Minako takes off for the outdoors, hiking, running and breathing in fresh air.



Remembering Oxnard Supervisor Carmen Ramirez 1948 - 2022
