You helped us open a new, larger health center in Reno to serve many more patients who need us – including abortion patients from out of state. Find more on page 4.


Your commitment is helping us turn a catastrophe into an opportunity in Stockton, California. Read about it on page 8.

Providing essential care for our patients often goes beyond the time they are in our health centers, and it can make all the difference in their lives. Take an abortion patient we saw at one of our Sacramento health centers.

A friend drove her in for her scheduled on-site abortion, and the patient brought her two-year-old along because she had no one to watch him at home. They didn't have a car seat, so she carried her child on her lap in the passenger seat.

As the patient and her friend stayed with the toddler in our health center waiting room, staff became concerned that the women didn't have a car seat for him when the patient was ready to leave after her procedure. It is not safe or legal for a young child to be in a car without being in a secure car seat.

But, after making some quick calls, including to a local Target store, the site's center manager, Adrianna S., was able to get a new car seat delivered to the health center by the time the patient's abortion care was completed. Adrianna presented the patient with her new car seat – free of charge – while she buckled it into the back seat of the car.

Mission accomplished!

This patient was able to leave our health center that day with the excellent, non-judgmental care she had expected – and some extra care she never would have imagined.

"This is one of the reasons it means so much to me to work here," Adrianna said. "We really go above and beyond to help our patients who need us."

Northern Nevada health center is now open!

One of Planned Parenthood Mar Monte's new sites, our long-awaited Northern Nevada health center, opened on November 1.

Thanks to your support, this amazing new building is twice as large as the old site, and it's easier to access from major transportation hubs, including for patients coming from Carson City or flying in from an abortion-ban state. It also has several more exam rooms as well as state-of-the-art medical equipment.

The transition is a significant milestone because Reno has been home to a PP health center for more than 50 years.

Center Manager Christina Hudson said it was bittersweet to leave the old health center because thousands of people have been helped at that site over the years. For example, in FY 2023 alone, PPMM subsidized more than \$2 million in care for over 5,000 uninsured patients in Reno.

But the new site will allow us to expand on that care and help many more who need us.

"We were grateful to have our (old) health center – it's a memory, a fixture in Reno," Reno Lead Clinician Kate Schopp said. "But at the new health center, every pressure point – from parking to exam room temperatures, to a lack of space – everything has a solution."

The new center is already getting raves from patients. Kate has heard more than one exclaim that it's the nicest health center they've ever been in.





On October 26, Planned Parenthood Mar Monte's Eastland Plaza health center in Stockton suffered catastrophic destruction from a fire that started when a person who was unhoused was trying to keep warm. The damage resulted in the roof collapsing and loss of equipment, including exam beds and the on-site laboratory.

Mar Monte staff were relieved that no other people were present at the time and no one was hurt at the center, which sees over 8,000 patient visits annually. The site is now temporarily closed, and patients are being re-directed to our health center in North Stockton.

Our goal is to re-open the Eastland Plaza site in about 10 months, and our rebuilding plans will focus on optimizing patient care, with more space for exam rooms so staff can serve more patients.

"It's heartbreaking because you see the damage, and we all take a lot of pride in our health center," Center Manager Lisa Riley said. "Eastland Plaza staff are wonderful. They work hard to have the center represent their commitment to patients."

Some of the center's patients walk or take the bus to get the care they need. The distance between the Eastland Plaza and North Stockton sites is about four miles – adding 20 minutes by bike, 40 minutes by bus, or more than hour on foot for an Eastland Plaza patient to make it to an appointment in North Stockton.

"We have much different demographics," Lisa said. "And even though the other health center is only 15 minutes away (by car), it's a hardship for some patients."

But having the North Stockton center in the same city has still been a boon since fire destroyed the Eastland Plaza site. "I am very, very grateful that we have been able to relocate to North Stockton," Lisa added. "It's been a smooth transition. We have a lot of longtime staff at Eastland Plaza, and our patients are really happy to see the same staff temporarily working at North Stockton."

The Eastland Plaza health center was designed generations ago, when ample space was needed for paper medical records and the flow of patient care was different. This is a chance to update the site in a way that best meets our patients' needs.

"I'm excited for the reimagination of the space," Lisa said. "My hope is to have more providers working here. We definitely have the demand."

Friends in Stockton

The recent fire that destroyed PPMM's Eastland Plaza health center was accidentally caused by a person who was unhoused and trying to stay warm. To support local social services, contact our friends at Children's Home of Stockton (CHS).

CHS operates a 16-bed short-term residential therapeutic program for foster youth ages 12-18 and an 18-bed housing and homeless-prevention program for youth ages 18-24. CHS served nearly 100 youth in FY2023 and is nationally accredited/Medi-Cal certified as a Specialty Mental Health Provider, offering services to promote long-term stability.
