

Upper Hudson Planned Parenthood COVID-19 Response



We are living in an unprecedented time. At Upper Hudson Planned Parenthood we are committed to the health and safety of our patients, staff, and community.

During this time of crisis, UHPP and our three health centers have been designated as essential providers, allowing our doors to stay open to all who need us. As other providers are overwhelmed with COVID-19 cases, UHPP is providing sexual and reproductive health services, abortion care, gender-affirming health care and behavioral health services that keep people safe and healthy and out of hospitals, urgent care centers, and primary care practices.

In response to this global pandemic, UHPP launched telehealth services and are utilizing PPDirect. PPDirect is an app that connects our patients with providers across the country to prescribe select birth control options and UTI treatment so patients can get the care they need from the safety of their homes. Telehealth, on the other hand, is a means to provide a full range of services with UHPP's medical professionals face-to-face with patients via a secure video connection.

Nationally, we are seeing a trend of Executive Orders classifying abortion care as non-essential services in an effort to restrict access in their states. Planned Parenthood Federation of America is fighting back by filing lawsuits on behalf of the affiliates in Texas, Ohio, Iowa, Alabama, Tennessee, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana. We are lucky that in New York, abortion access is protected by the Reproductive Health Act.

At our health centers we are adhering to the proper infection control as well as all necessary precautions including social distancing both inside and outside of our health centers. We are asking patients that are sick or experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 not come to our health center. We have also suspended walk-ins and emergency contraception is still available at the front desk at no cost.

As always, UHPP will continue to work closely with the state and county Departments of Health to be as responsive and safe as possible for our patients, staff, and community members. Our administrative staff is working remotely and continuing to support our health center staff and patients.

Sex Education During COVID-19

Our team has adapted programming to work on Google Classroom and other online programs, and are providing programs in schools in Albany, Columbia and Rensselaer counties. Even our Youth Health Promoters have shifted their outreach to be completely online through Snapchat, Instagram, Facebook and TikTok.
