## Information for Informed Consent SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTION (STI) TREATMENT WITHOUT TESTING

Your sex partner was treated for an STI. You probably have the same infection. You should be treated to

- Prevent problems for yourself
- Avoid spreading the infection back to your partner and others

You have not had a test. There is no proof that you have an infection. We offer you this treatment because there is a very good chance you are infected too. We recommend that you be tested to know for sure.

You may also have an STI(s) other than the one your partner was treated for. The only way to be sure is to be tested.

Read the information about the medicine we give you. Take all the medicine on time until it is all gone. Do not have sex until 7 days after you've taken all the medicine. You can still pass the infection to your sex partners if you have unprotected sex — vaginal, anal, or oral — before.

If you have other sex partners, tell them you are getting treated for a STI so they can get treated too.
