INCREASING ACCESS, BUILDING A MOVEMENT

Your extraordinary activism and support is **building** a powerful movement to support sexual and reproductive health across Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont – helping Planned Parenthood of Northern New England (PPNNE) weather unprecedented defunding threats and attacks on access to care. Thank you!

IN 2017, PPNNE:

Saw a huge increase in **volunteer engagement** with a total of 12,035 volunteer hours and 4,059 shifts worked. Each state saw significant increases in volunteers with Maine leading the way with a 150% increase (719 people) in 2017.

Started a **Transcare Fund** – a special fund to support care for Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming patients.

Saw an **increase in patients** across our 3 states.

Helped enact proactive legislation.

Continued our overarching work to reduce **unintended pregnancy** rates in northern New England.

HEALTH SERVICES


PPNNE provided expert, high quality, and non-judgemental reproductive and sexual health care through our 21 health centers in Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont.

In 2017, PPNNE increased capacity to meet rising need for our services through increased staffing, team-centered patient care, centralized clinical support, and online appointment scheduling, and started the **Health Center Advocacy Program (HCAP)** where patients share their reproductive health stories with Planned Parenthood volunteers, and get information about how to get involved.

We are working to reach and better serve atrisk populations through expanded access to quality family planning services/information, and increasing awareness of the most effective birth control – Long Acting Reversible Contraception (LARCs) - leading to fewer unintended pregnancies and improved public health. PPNNE provided 6,410 LARC insertions in 2017 – a more than 300% increase since 2010 - making us a national leader by reducing barriers to access.

PPNNE was able to launch a new Fund to **Support Care for Transgender and Gender** Non-Conforming Patients, to ensure that our transgender patients have equitable access to care - no matter their income, age, employment status or other factors. It joins the Laura Fund that helps patients who choose abortion care

and the Cancer Screening Access Fund that supports patients who need advanced screening and treatment for abnormal paps.

& OUTREACH

Through a wide range of programs, PPNNE brings **sexuality education and information** to people in Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine. Providing medically-accurate and comprehensive information is essential for reducing STDs and unintended pregnancy, and empowering young people to build pathways to opportunity.

IN 2017, 22 teens served as peer educators in 4 high schools in VT and NH. These teens had 4,106 conversations about sexual health with their peers, and planned 42 events reaching 2,113 people in their schools and communities. In addition, PPNNE staff conducted over 300 outreach activities and presentations, reaching young people, parents, and vulnerable populations across VT, NH, and ME.

LOOKING AHEAD

PPNNE's goal is to achieve consistent education across northern New England. To that end we are developing partnerships to begin to deliver Get Real, a curriculum for middle school students that gives young people the information and skills they need to protect their health. Young people need to understand what a healthy relationship looks like and have the opportunity to practice good communication skills before they become sexually active and Get Real has been shown to do just that. REDUCING UNINTENDED PREGNANCY

PPNNE programs and services have played a significant role in bringing teen pregnancy rates in our region to among the lowest in the nation. Yet even with this progress, overall unintended pregnancy remains a major public health issue and a driver of inequality. Women's ability to control their reproductive lives is at the heart of many issues – from poverty to educational and career attainment.

45%

of all pregnancies are unintended. Young women and vulnerable populations are disproportionately impacted with unintended pregnancy rising to:

59% of pregnancies of women in their early twenties

60% of pregnancies of women living in poverty

86% of pregnancies of women with opioid substance use disorders

And so, despite unprecedented attacks, we continue to advance proactive work and an ambitious long-term **vision for lowering unintended pregnancy rates, creating pathways to opportunity** through our Equity in Pregnancy Intention Campaign (EPIC). This multifaceted program brings together organization investments in education, outreach, partnerships and collaborations, training, and enhanced and integrated health care, making the most effective birth control methods easily accessible, and creating lasting cultural change around abortion.

As the leading reproductive health care provider in this region, PPNNE is positioned to drive innovation and collaboration to achieve a real impact on unintended pregnancy rates – empowering women, men, and teens to achieve their reproductive life plans, making it easier to finish school, pursue career aspirations, and break the cycle of poverty.

PUBLIC POLICY

In 2017, PPNNE and our sister organizations, the Planned Parenthood Action Funds in each state, fought back relentless attacks on reproductive health care and rights and fought forward to secure proactive legislation to protect and expand access to care and equitable health policy. PPNNE supporters who make up a powerful grassroots movement were key to these victories.

Community Action Teams made up of passionate activists and volunteers are mobilizing across the region, in areas such as Chittenden County, and Brattleboro, VT; Concord, Manchester, Keene and Seacoast, NH; the Upper Valley (NH/VT); and southern, central and downeast ME. Campus groups at colleges across northern New England, including UVM, Middlebury, UNH, Dartmouth, UMaine, USM, Colby, Bates and many others, are educating and engaging their campus communities. PPNNE's volunteer programs offer many ways for supporters to get involved and make a difference. Together, we are creating long-term sustainable change.

In Maine, we had a national impact. Recognizing the critical role Senator Susan Collins' vote would play in protecting access to care, the Planned Parenthood Maine Action Fund mobilized supporters soon after the 2016 election, training volunteers, placing dozens of op-eds and letters to the editors, and driving thousands of phone calls into the Senator's office asking her to stand strong and fight for Planned Parenthood. And she did. Our work to win Senator Collins' support was vital in stopping multiple attempts to repeal the Affordable Care Act and defund Planned Parenthood in 2017. One of the most far-reaching victories in 2017 was passing a referendum that expands Medicaid coverage to 70,000 Mainers.

In New Hampshire, the Planned Parenthood New Hampshire Action Fund defeated budget attempts to defund PPNNE, and stopped bills that would have compromised access to quality reproductive and sexual health care in New Hampshire by restricting abortion care and an attempt to repeal the health center buffer zone law, which is a key tool for ensuring patient safety and privacy.

In Vermont, the Planned Parenthood Vermont Action Fund advanced pro-active legislation, including a bill that requires insurance companies to report back to the legislature on how they would provide full coverage with no cost sharing for overthe-counter contraceptives without a prescription once any new contraceptives become available over the counter. This bill came about because the FDA is currently reviewing an application for the progestin only birth control pill to be available over the counter. We want to ensure that people who use this method now, will continue to access their contraceptive method with no cost sharing.

"The experiences I've gone through as a trans person with mental illness have been difficult, and arduous, and sometimes unbearable. However, when I came to Planned Parenthood to start my hormone therapy, I felt like the awful experiences of my past were finally behind me. No more invalidation, no more shame. I was finally able to simply express my goals and honestly discuss my struggles without fear. PP has been such a positive force in my life, and I could not be happier about my decision to be a patient here."



BRIDGING THE GAP

Innovative Social Change Canvassing on Abortion

The need to shift our society's culture around gender, sex, abortion, and sexuality could not be clearer:

- 401 abortion restrictions enacted by states since 2011
- Relentless legislative attacks in NH and ME
- PPNNE defunded in NH twice since 2011

PPNNE, in collaboration with the Planned Parenthood Maine Action Fund, has developed a groundbreaking social change model to combat abortion stigma and build a larger, more powerful sexual and reproductive health movement.

This deep canvassing project empowers trained volunteers to use story-telling and non-judgmental listening to change voters' negative beliefs about abortion and inspire increased engagement in advocacy campaigns to improve abortion access. Our project is yielding impressive results: more than a quarter of voters we canvass become more supportive of abortion access.

LOOKING AHEAD:

We are conducting a robust field study and partnering with political scientists from Cornell, Stanford, and UC-Berkeley to demonstrate the impact and effectiveness of this model, which we will share with other Planned Parenthood affiliates to assist in the development of their own deep canvassing programs.


